DPHF Annual Grant Updates

Osteosarcoma Vaccine.

As you may remember, DPHF had been offering grants to individuals who had Dobermans involved in the pilot project, testing a drug that was believed to extend the life expectancy of dogs who had been treated for Osteosarcoma. In order to be eligible, the dogs were required to complete the traditional treatment including amputation and chemotherapy. Following those procedures, the dog would be eligible to participate in the trial period which involved a series of injectable vaccines. DPHF's grant covered the cost of one of the vaccines, if the owner committed to sharing results of their participation in the study.

We reached out to find out the status of the study and were disappointed to learn that the company had been purchased and that the study had been cancelled due to concerns about the potential for listeria.

We would like to share that we did have one recipient of the grant while the study was active. We are thrilled to report that the treatments appear to have been beneficial in this case. Hans, pictured below, is alive, happy and energetic 2-1/2 years after participating in the study.



Gene Splicing Project - University of Florida

DPHF has reached out to Dr. Estrada of the University of Florida to see how her project was progressing in these challenging times.

As a quick reminder, the study will include both the "PDK4" (DCM1) gene as well as the "Titan" (DCM2) gene. The process will involve growing heart cells in a petri dish and measuring flexibility response to certain fuels. The bad genes will then be removed and replaced with good genes and the response to those fuels will be measured again. If there is no response in flexibility, it will indicate that there is another contributing factor that has not yet been identified.

The project did suffer some delays early in the year due to the challenges presented by COVID 19, especially in the areas of access to patients while areas were locked down. However, they are pleased to announce that they are moving forward once again; having added procedures to protect the health and safety of both the staff and patients.

Thanks to funding from DPHF some encouraging pilot studies have been completed. These studies have resulted in additional funding from The Morris Foundation as well as support from the University of Florida for a post doctoral fellowship (Dr. Lilian Shen, DVM) in genomic medicine to work on this project and a Cardiology Residency.

The researchers are currently designing the gene construct for a benchtop evaluation.

High Frequency QRS Electrocardiography - University of Illinois

This study is being conducted by Dr. Tamas Ambrisko, with the hope of developing a new screening method for early detection of DCM which would facilitate early treatment and informed breeding decisions. The vision is to create an inexpensive, small portable device that would automatically analyze the signal and indicate the probability of DCM.

The data collection and database development are complete and the researchers are currently working on digital processing of the ECG signals. DPHF funds have also been used to purchase a high end computer for the purpose of programming machine learning.

Fund Raising

The decrease in dog shows and performance events has had an effect on our traditional fundraising. With the events that we traditionally rely upon for raffles being cancelled, we are looking at other avenues to raise funds and awareness without relying on "in person" contact with DPHF Ambassadors.

On-Line Auction

DPHF Is currently researching options to hold an online auction to take the place of our annual Tex's Tribute. We are evaluating various services in an attempt to find a solution that results in the lowest overhead, both financially and manpower required while reaching as many supporters as possible.
